Moments like these in which the community comes together to celebrate, fraternize and create bonds of friendship among all, are part of the life of a parish community.


The canon law of the Church defines the parish as "a certain community of faithful constituted in a stable way in the particular Church, whose pastoral care" (can. 515). For this reason, our parish is not a station for religious or liturgical services, but a true family, a community of brothers who praise God together, celebrate the Eucharist in the church, but also celebrate and share with joy. This was the first community of Christians, as described in the book of the Acts of the Apostles: "They attended the teaching of the apostles, to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayers... Every day they met in the Temple with enthusiasm, they broke bread in their homes and shared their meals with joy and with great simplicity of heart." (Acts 2). In other words, the community not only celebrated the Eucharist and went to pray at the temple, but also lived and ate together with joy.

Our Kermes offered us the opportunity to organize, work and celebrate together to get to know each other better and rediscover ourselves as a family of brothers and sisters in Christ capable, not only of participating together in a liturgical function, but also of having fun and sharing a very good meal together. .

May God bless you all and may the Saint Joseph parish community continue to grow in holiness and joy, under the loving gaze of our common Father in Heaven.
